- except for small caps. Remove lids from jars and containers
- or packaging (i.e bag of cereals in a cereal box). Separate different materials from the same container
- even when lightly used, before placing them in the bin. Crush aluminum sheets into compact balls,
- Undo and fold your cardboard boxes.
